Safety and Civil Protection

The safety of residents, workers, and visitors across the territory of Parma, Piacenza, and Reggio Emilia is entrusted to a multi-tiered civil protection system operating at the municipal, provincial, and regional levels. On this page, you will find essential information and guidelines on how to act in the event of an emergency.

Stay Informed in Real Time

Emilia-Romagna Weather Alerts

The Region's official portal issues daily surveillance bulletins utilizing a color-coded system (from green for no hazard, to red for extreme conditions) for each area across the region. It is the primary resource to consult before undertaking an excursion in the Apennines or in the event of forecasted severe weather.

Local Civil Protection Plans

Each capital municipality across the destination has its own Civil Protection Plan, which outlines local risks and the procedures to address them:

These are complemented by the Provincial and Area Civil Protection Plans, updated by the Emilia-Romagna Region for the three provinces in October 2025.





If you manage an accommodation facility or tourism business

- In the event of an orange or red alert, evaluate with your guests the option of rescheduling planned outdoor activities or excursions.
- Stay updated on communications from your Municipality and the DTEmilìa Steering Committee during major events that may lead to high visitor volumes or changes to local traffic in your area.
- Consult the Sustainability Best Practices Guide for Accommodation Facilities for guidance on energy and water management during critical weather conditions.

Major Events

During high-attendance events (concerts, festivals, trade fairs), Municipalities, the Prefecture, law enforcement agencies, and organizers establish a dedicated coordination committee to manage safety and crowd flows. DTEmilìa contributes by providing specific tourist information for visitors. If you are attending a major event, always follow the instructions provided by the organizers and on-site personnel.
